2023 Walgreens National Concerto Competition Winners Results Announced!

On Friday, Dec 29 & Saturday, Dec 30, 2023, the Midwest Young Artists Conservatory hosted the annual Walgreens National Concerto Competition at their musical center in Highwood, IL.



Over 200 exceptional young musicians from all corners of the country competed in Midwest Young Artist Conservatory's 2023 Walgreens National Concerto Competition on December 29 and 30, 2023 at the MYAC Center in Fort Sheridan, Highwood, IL. Entries in String, Piano, Winds, and Vocal Categories in both MYAC and Open divisions yielded one overall winner who will solo with the MYAC Symphony Orchestra in February. Each division winner, along with honorable mentions in all categories within the two divisions are also listed on the website here.

The Walgreens concerto competition has grown from approximately 35 competing young artists in 1994, to a record 212 in 2023, making it the largest and most comprehensive of its kind in the Midwest. The competition has both a Junior Division (grades 8 and under) and a Senior Division (grades 9 through 12). Two panels of distinguished experts representing String, Piano, Vocal and Wind Instrument Categories judge the participants, delivering individual comments on each performance. MYAC annually provides students with preeminent judges, a video recording of their performance, written performance evaluations and an inviting and nurturing environment in which to participate.

Overall winners will perform on **Saturday**, **February 24**, **2024** at **Northwestern University's Pick-Staiger Concert Hall**. Category winners will perform at MYAC's Music at The Fort Recital on **Sunday**, **January 28**, **2024**. Winning soloists may also be selected for performance opportunities with area professional and community orchestras.
