She has been teaching general music and choir to kindergarten through fifth grade students at Avoca West School in Glenview since 2008. Under her leadership, the choral program has shown tremendous growth. Elizabeth has also taught elementary music in Highland Park and middle school choir in Kenosha, Wisconsin and Plano, Texas, where her non-varsity treble choir consistently received superior ratings at the annual University Interscholastic League (UIL) choir contest.
