2022 Walgreens Competition Winners Announced, hosted by Midwest Young Artists Conservatory

HIGHWOOD, IL. - Over 200 exceptional young musicians from all corners of the country competed in Midwest Young Artist Conservatory's 2022 Walgreens National Concerto Competition from December 28 to December 30 at the MYAC Center in Fort Sheridan, Highwood, IL. Entries in String, Piano, Winds, and Vocal Categories in both MYAC and Open divisions yielded one overall winner who will solo with the MYAC Symphony Orchestra in the spring. First, second, and third prizes, along with honorable mentions in all categories within the two divisions are also named on the website.

The Walgreens concerto competition has grown from approximately 35 competing young artists in 1994, to a record 226 in 2022, making it the largest and most comprehensive of its kind in the Midwest. The competition has both a Junior Division (grades 8 and under) and a Senior Division (grades 9 through 12). Four panels of distinguished experts representing String, Piano, Vocal and Wind Instrument Categories judge the participants, delivering individual comments on each performance. Walgreens Corporation's annual sponsorship enables MYAC to provide students with preeminent judges, a video recording of their performance, written performance evaluations, and an inviting and nurturing environment in which to participate.

Overall winners will perform at the February 25, 2023 MYAC concert at Pick-Staiger Concert Hall at Northwestern University, as well as MYAC's Music at The Fort Recital on February 12, 2023. Winning soloists may also be selected for performance opportunities with area professional and community orchestras.
